NIH Awards to Medical School Departments Diagnostic Radiology in Fiscal Year 2018

The total amount of NIH dollars going to Principal Investigators (Contact PIs and MPis) having a primary appointment in Diagnostic Radiology Departments has **increased 19.5%** in FY 2018 as compared to FY 2017 (**\$598,407,039.96 vs \$500,850,376.00**).
