NIH Awards to Medical School Departments Diagnostic Radiology in Fiscal Year 2019

The total amount of NIH dollars going to Principal Investigators (Contact PIs and MPis) having a primary appointment in Diagnostic Radiology Departments has increased 15.4% in FY 2019 as compared to FY 2018 (\$691,222,041.79 vs. \$598,810,010.49).

The Academy leverages this data as a strong advocacy tool on behalf of our community, which is why the staff continues to collect the data. In addition, we appreciate that many academic radiology leaders use this data for benchmarking their programs and advocating for their departments. The growth in multi-investigator collaborative research has led to challenges in apportioning credit in a formal ranking system. The Academy's goal is to identify a transparent way to disseminate the data in order to empower departments and protect the perception of the Academy's role in the dissemination. **After much discussion about how this project intersects with the Academy's mission and its overall value to our membership, the Executive Committee has voted to disseminate the data in a new and more dynamic format.
